

## Chicago No. 1 city for men, boasts guy-friendly digs

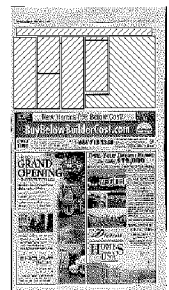
### McClurg Court Center
